NCAN Report: \$3.75 Billion in Pell Grants Goes Unclaimed for High School Class of 2021

Financial aid makes education after high school more affordable – but first, students have to apply for this funding. And for a variety of reasons, that does not always happen.

The high school class of 2021 left an estimated \$3.75 billion in Pell Grants on the table by not completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), according to a new National College Attainment Network (NCAN) analysis.

College and Career Planning in the Middle Grades

Feb. 28 - April 15

This course focuses on early career awareness and planning, developing successful social-emotional skills, transitions into middle and high school and academic engagement.

Building a College-Going Culture for All Students

April 4 - May 9

This course is designed to help school staff collect and analyze relevant data and transform their programs and services in order to improve the postsecondary success of their students.

College, Career & Academic Planning

May 23 - June 7

This course is designed to help elementary school counselors build their knowledge and skills in several areas, including how to create a college-going culture, communicate the value and affordability of postsecondary education, increase student career exploration, use data to support success and help students develop "non-cognitive" skills.

March 7 - April 11

This course is designed for college access advisers, teachers, after-school staff, etc. It teaches professional approaches and provides resources for advising students in planning, applying, paying for and succeeding in education after high school.

This course helps counselors develop the skills and knowledge required to help homeless and foster-care students, students with disabilities, immigrant and refugee students, and LGBTQ students with applying, financing and transitioning into education after high school.

The Education Forward Arizona Scholarship is open!

Since 2005, Education Forward Arizona has worked with students enrolled in postsecondary education across the state of Arizona to provide support services that empower them to persist and thrive through college and beyond.

The 2022/2023 Education Forward Arizona Scholarship Application will be due on **March 4**, **2022** and the new cohort of Ed Forward AZ Scholars will be announced in May.

Scholarship Awards

- Student may be eligible to receive up to \$6,000 per year (\$2,000 \$3,000 per semester) for 4 years
- Intended for students planning to obtain a bachelor's degree within 4 years (Community college for the first 2 years is an option)
- Mentoring and Success Services are included

Eligibility

- Be an active member of, and recommended by, one of our <u>College Access</u> Partner Organizations
- Demonstrate high potential and motivation to succeed in college
- Have a 3.0 Weighted Cumulative GPA
- Be a graduate of an Arizona high school and entering a college or a university as a first-time enrollee
- Meet the criteria to receive Federal Student Aid, be Pell Grant eligible and able to demonstrate significant financial need as reported on the FAFSA
- DACA recipients are also eligible
