NCAN: Congress Finalizes Bipartisan Federal Funding Deal: \$400 Pell Grant Increase Coming

After prolonged negotiations, Congress has finally reached an agreement to fund the government through September 2022. Lawmakers hope to vote on and enact the \$1.5 trillion bipartisan legislation this week.

There's some good news for NCAN members and students in the bill: a \$400 increase to the maximum Pell Grant for the 2022-23 award year. This brings the max award to \$6,895 and is the largest single boost to Pell in more than a decade (since the 2009-10 award year).

"NCAN applauds congressional leaders for including a \$400 increase to the maximum Pell Grant in the omnibus appropriations bill – a step in the right direction toward our priority of doubling the max grant amount," said NCAN CEO Kim Cook. "We urge Congress to pass this Pell Grant increase to make college more affordable and help reverse recent enrollment declines."
