# **Foster Care Definition**

# Foster Care Definition

#### **Definition**

24-hour substitute care for children placed away from their parents or guardians and for whom the child welfare agency has placement and care responsibility

#### Child welfare agencies

- •DCS
- •Tribal
- •local

Children in foster care are not considered 'homeless' or McKinney-Vento eligible.

# Fostering Connections Act

# The child welfare agency must have a plan for school stability

#### **CWA Assurances**

- placement considers the appropriateness of the current educational setting and the proximity to the school in which the child is enrolled at the time of placement; and
- coordination to ensure that the child remains in the school in which the child is enrolled at the time of placement; or
- if remaining in such school is not in the best interests of the child, the CWA and LEA provide immediate and appropriate enrollment in a new school, with all the educational records of the child provided to the school



# Arizona Tuition Waiver Education & Training Voucher

In foster care after 14th birthday

Through Arizona Tuition Waiver, state colleges & universities will waive tuition after PELL Grant & institutional aid is applied.

In foster care after 16th birthday

Eligible for Education & Training Voucher if attending qualified colleges, universities, or vocational education programs





# Which financial resources apply to me?

There are different resources available depending on what age you were in foster care. The following pages will provide you with more details about the resources available to you based on the age you were in foster care and a description of each resource. Depending on the information you provided on the FAFSA and your course of study, your school may also offer you other federal grants in addition to the Pell Grant and/or a work-study job.



<sup>\*</sup> The Pell Grant, Education and Training Voucher (ETV) funds, and the Arizona Tuition Waiver are only awarded to students who were in foster care at the above ages, who are residents of Arizona (ETV funds and Arizona Tuition Waiver), and who are U.S. Citizens or qualified non-citizens. #### **Match-Savings Program**

- Students save \$500, the program will provide \$4,500 over 2 semesters
  - For foster care, Earn to Learn will give the students the initial \$500.

#### **Our Mission**

Aliento works with undocumented, DACA, and mixed immigration status families to transform trauma into hope and action.

We are youth-led and directly impacted people and allies who are invested in the well being, emotional healing, and leadership development of those impacted by the inequities of lacking an immigrations status.











## Prop. 308

**Prop. 308** allows for all Arizona high school graduates including Arizona Dreamers to be eligible for in-state tuition and publicly funded scholarships when a student:

- Attended a public or private high school or homeschool equivalent while physically present in Arizona for at least two years
- **Graduated** from any public, private high (2) school, or homeschool in Arizona or obtained a GED















#### **CSS Profile**

- **Need-based** financial aid for Arizona's public universities (ASU, NAU, UofA)
- Students who are ineligible for FAFSA can apply
- Application fee is free for students whose family income is less than \$100,000

















## **How to Complete the Application**

- Collect documents
  - Student and parent most recent tax returns
  - Student and parent W-2 forms and other records of yearly income
  - Records of untaxed income, bank statements, healthcare not covered by insurance, etc.

If students <u>do not</u> have one or more of the documents that were suggested to make the application process easier, using <u>reasonable estimates</u> and using \$0 when applicable, is acceptable.

- Create College Board account, go to the CSS application for desired school year
- Complete all sections and include the school's CSS Code
- Review the application and submit







## **Tips When Applying**

- Undocumented students will choose "Other" when asked about citizenship status
- If no visa or B2 (visitor visa), it should be left blank
- Short answer questions at the end of the application should be answered, they may be used for future aid


