The Arizona College Access Network's (AzCAN) College Access Professional (CAP) Trainings are for professionals who work with students to prepare them to be successful in exploring, planning for, and pursuing education after high school.

HOW ARE THE COURSES STRUCTURED?

These NEWLY UPDATED courses are Arizona-specific and include scholarly readings, online discussions with peers and assignments that can be implemented into programming with students. Participants will be able to create a plan that contributes to the college-going culture of their school or organization.
