WHAT ARE CAP TRAINING COURSES?

The Arizona College Access Network's (AzCAN) College Access Professional (CAP) Trainings are for professionals who work with students to prepare them to be successful in exploring, planning for, and pursuing education or training after high school.

HOW ARE THE COURSES STRUCTURED?

These 4-week asynchronous courses are Arizona-specific and include scholarly readings, online discussions, and assignments that can be implemented into programming with students, families, and colleagues. Participants will be able to create a plan that contributes to the college-going culture of their school or organization.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

CAP Training courses are open to all college access professionals in Arizona including:

- Teachers

- Administrators
- College Access Advisors

HOW MUCH DO CAP COURSES COST?

- \$60.00 per course
- For an additional \$75.00 per course, participants can also earn graduate credit through Lindenwood University for ADE recertification purposes under Options B and C
